Following the administration of an anaesthetic and / or sedative earlier today, your pet may be subdued for the next 24 - 48 hours.

- Antibiotic protection and painkillers have been administered by injection.
- The sutures are dissolvable and will not require removal.
- The external sutures are not dissolvable and will require removal by our trained staff in days.
- You may find shaved areas on your pet's leg or neck where blood samples have been taken or intravenous injections have been administered.
- Keep all dressings dry and clean. Be sure to secure any waterproof protection with elastoplasts and never use an elastic band. Such protection should be removed indoors.
- Prevent your pet from scratching, licking and biting the wound. If necessary, a protective Elizabethan Collar can be supplied. Please enquire at Reception.
- Should swelling occur below the dressing, attempt to loosen or remove the bandage and contact the surgery immediately.
- Your pet should be restricted indoors for days.
- Your dog should have lead exercise only for days / weeks.
